Streets is located at 430 Vance Avenue, between the Medical District and the heart of Downtown Memphis. From East Memphis, take Walnut Grove to Union Avenue. After passing through Midtown, take a left on Danny Thomas, pass through Linden, and at the next stoplight take a right on Vance. The Streets facility will be on your right.

When

Why...the background checks?

Over the last few years, things have changed...a lot. Although we do apologize for any inconvenience caused by this requirement, we hope you'll understand that it is impossible for us to maintain insurance as a youth agency without processing an application, personal reference checks, and a background check for all of our volunteers.

General Information About Streets:

Mission Statement

The mission of Streets Ministries is to serve impoverished youth in the Memphis metropolitan area by unconditionally representing the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and deed in such a way that underserved adolescents have the opportunity to see, hear, and respond to the Good News of the Gospel, and to be empowered to live a life of obedience to God.

History

In 1987, God called Ken Bennett to a life of service in the most desperate neighborhoods of Memphis, with the firm conviction that the only path to true and enduring change for this area was through the hope found in Jesus Christ. What began with a van, a basketball and a heart to trust God on a daily basis is now a thriving, dynamic outreach to hundreds of kids who deserve the same chance to succeed as those born to more fortunate circumstances.

Overview

Streets is a Christian ministry dedicated to serving the youth of Memphis. Streets has been serving the students of the 38126 zip code since 1987. For the youth of this neighborhood, there is easy access to drugs, high rates of teen pregnancies, an overwhelming high-school drop-out rate, and very little relational and family stability. Therefore, our goals reflect the needs of the youth that we serve. Streets provides a place for students to come and hang out after school, ensuring that they will have a safe haven with resources and support. In the afternoons, we have an open facility during which any student is welcomed into the Streets facility and is able to play games, basketball, meet friends, and have a safe place to enjoy.

Programs

All students are invited, not required, to take advantage of our extensive and helpful programming. In this, Streets' goals include meeting the physical needs of the youth and their families, tutoring the students in order to better their education, teaching values and morals through mentoring, developing deeper relationships, and providing discipleship in order to point towards their greatest hope, God. Listed below are some of our programs which include volunteer opportunities.

Weekly Commitment:

Pathways Tutoring

Pathways is our educational mentoring program and is the most relationally involved of all our programs. Student and mentor work through Streets' own curriculum, which focuses on specific educational objectives. Tutoring lasts one hour a week, but the goal of Pathways is that a deeper relationship between the mentor and student is formed through more extensive involvement with each other. This can include anything from meeting for dinner to attending sporting events together to visiting colleges. We encourage our mentors to push their students spiritually, relationally, and academically. We have hours available between 3:00 and 6:00, Monday through Thursday, unless an alternate time can be established.

Ready Readers

Ready Readers takes place on the campus of the local elementary school during school hours. Here, adults are paired with students who are below proficient in reading skills. The results of this program are astounding, and each volunteer is asked to spend an hour with the children once a week.

Periodic Opportunities:

Snacks and Drinks

"Club" is one of our primary programs for sharing the Gospel with our students. High School Club is on Monday nights at 7:00 p.m., Middle School Club meets Thursdays at 6:00 p.m., and Elementary Club is on Fridays at 3:30 p.m. After setting up, the students usually sing, watch skits, hear the gospel, and have snacks. During the summer, we have movie nights for the students. Please consider providing snacks one night a semester/year for these clubs. You can arrive about 15 minutes early to unload. If you can stick around for "Club," then we would love to have you serve snacks at the end. This is a great opportunity for both individuals and groups and can be a lot of fun!

Streets Smarts

Streets Smarts is our elementary after-school program which takes place in our facility. Students are able to come in the afternoons to work on homework, play games, watch movies, work on reading skills, and hang out. Volunteers are needed to assist with crowd control, homework, and build relationships with the students. This commitment can be once a week, once a month, or as you can come.

Room Adopters

Room Adopters is a great way to serve the hard working teachers of the local elementary school. Volunteers act as a “teacher’s aid” for one hour per week, serving the teacher by either grading papers, reading to students, tutoring, filing papers, etc. Volunteers also throw four parties a year for their classroom, one party per quarter. Room Adopters is a great program for a group of volunteers, like a Sunday school group, a community group, or a group of friends, so that volunteers are able to rotate weekly classroom visits and plan the classroom parties together.

Newsletter Team

The primary way we communicate with our supporters is through our printed newsletter, which we print six times each year. This is a very important aspect of our ministry, because it helps us to promote Streets and ultimately raise support. With over 1,800 addresses on our mailing list, we have a lot of newsletters to fold! Let us know if you’re interested in helping with this, so you can join us for our morning “folding parties” at Streets every other month.

Recreation

Each afternoon from 2:30-6:00 during the school year and from 1:00-5:00 during the summer, Streets provides a safe place for students to come and hang out, play games, basketball, meet friends, and hang out with staff and volunteers. Volunteers are needed to coach basketball, baseball, and other teams in intramural leagues as well as to help monitor open gym and participate in community sports events.

Statement of Faith

- I. The Bible is the Word of God, without error, and the supreme authority in all areas of life.
- II. The God of the Bible is the only true and living God. There are no others. God exists as a Trinity – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.
- III. All people are created in the image of God, and as a result are worthy of dignity and respect. At creation, the first man and woman were without sin, in perfect relationship with God. However, the first man and woman were separated from a right relationship with God by their disobedience (sin). All people are now born sinful, and no one is acceptable to God by themselves.
